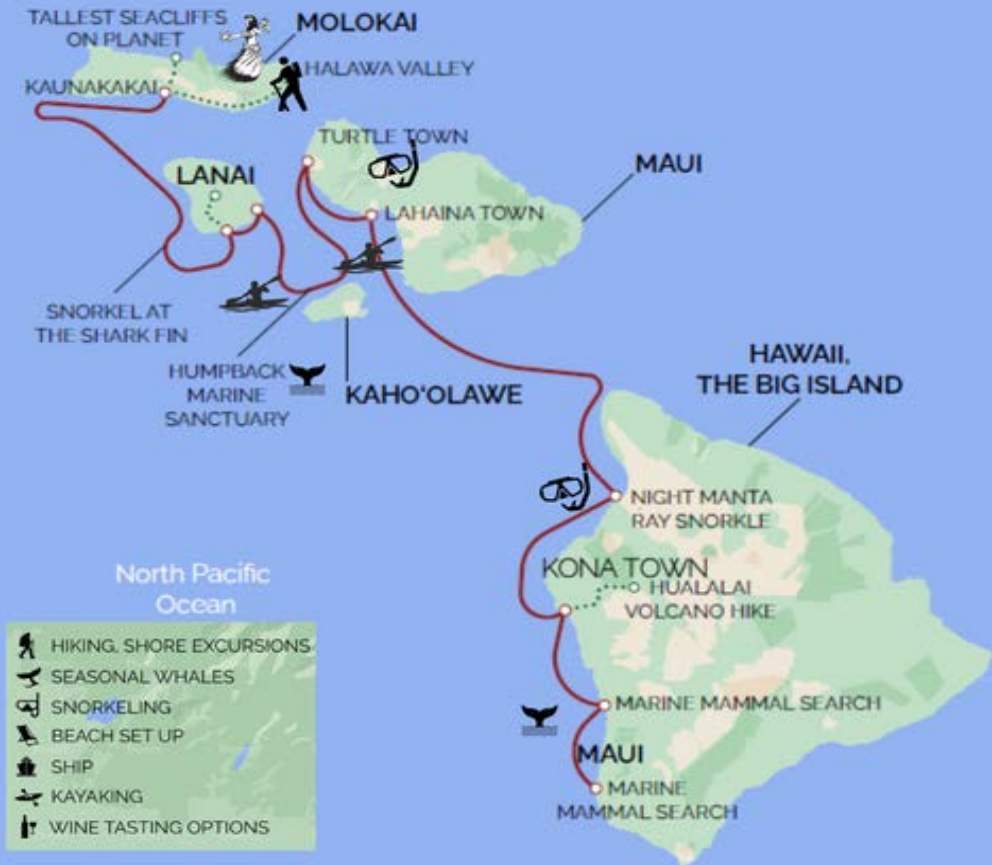

# Baja Sur, Mexico's Sea of Cortés

Playtime is key in Mexico's Sea of Cortés. Snorkeling with sea lions is often a highlight, but the dolphins, starfish, and butterfly fish certainly don't disappoint. And when it's beach party day, lounge in the sand or grab a paddle board. On land it's up the ridge you go. By mule or on foot, the landscape shifts from desert, to beach, to sea, and back again. Take a hike lined with cardon, cholla, and pitaya cacti with a pop of a red prickly poppy. Iguanas on land and blue-footed boobies above, your adventure buddies are all around.

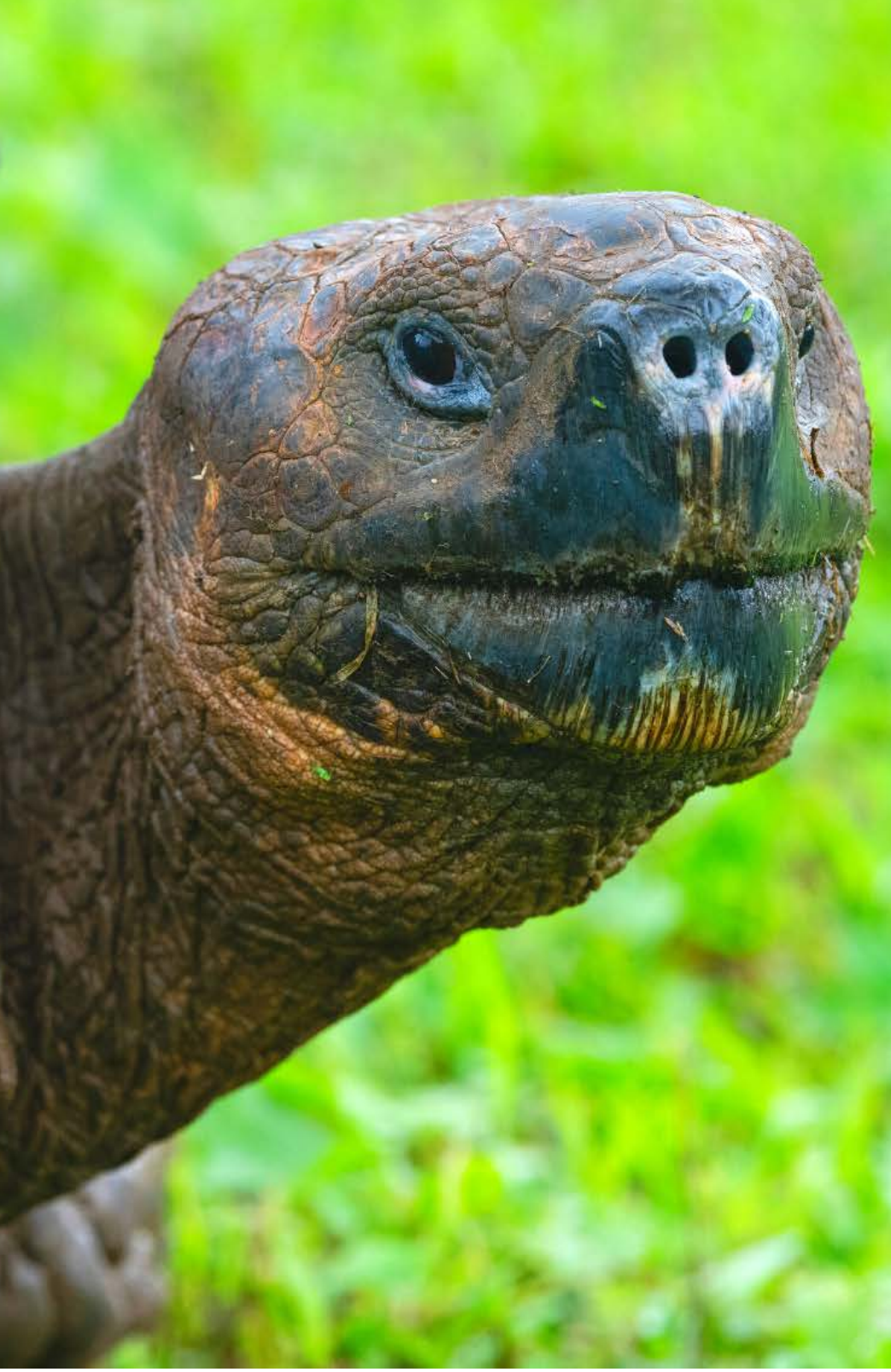

# Galápagos Islands

Dozens and dozens of three-foot-long iguanas pile up like sandbags. Watch your step. Wildlife in the Galápagos isn't afraid to walk—or lie—around. And because these animals don't encounter predators, they're not afraid to get up close to you. Iguanas plop down on pathways and tortoises are in no hurry to get out of the way.

The Galápagos Islands belong to the animals. From millions of years ago to now, each island is filled with discoveries and its own endemic species. Visit the Charles Darwin Research Station for an inside peek at the conservation efforts of the giant tortoise. On Isla Floreana, paddle board alongside sea lions or stroll the white sand beaches as rays relax on the sea floor. Snorkel or kayak along Isla Isabela's dramatic landscape of eroded tuff cones. Hike Isla Santa Cruz's Dragon Hill, eyes peeled for expert lounging land iguanas and maybe a flamingo or two.



# Extend Your Stay

## Machu Picchu



Explore Peru's famed Machu Picchu and the Sacred Valley on a 6-night guided post-cruise land tour. Visit Chinchero, a traditional weaving town in the Sacred Valley before touring the Inca hill town and ruins of Ollantaytambo. Ride the Vistadome rail to Machu Picchu, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, where a hike to the Inca Bridge rewards with views, ruins, colossal stairways, temple architecture, and impressive terracing. Hike up to Inti Punku, the "Sun Gate," and the terminus of the Inca Trail with an option to continue up Mount Machu Picchu. In Cusco, visit the Temple of the Sun, cathedral, and the Sacsayhuamán stone fortress before a farewell dinner.

View window and a sliding glass door opening to a small balcony; private bath with Jacuzzi tub and shower



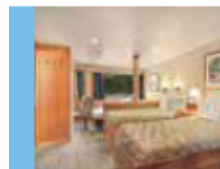
**Trailblazer (TRB)**

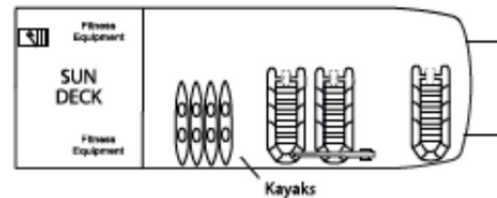

# Safari Voyager

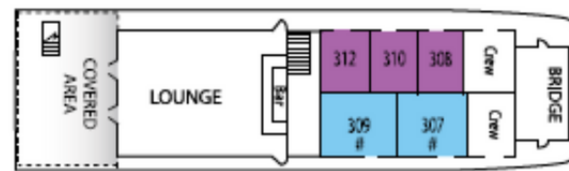

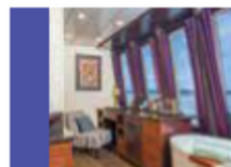

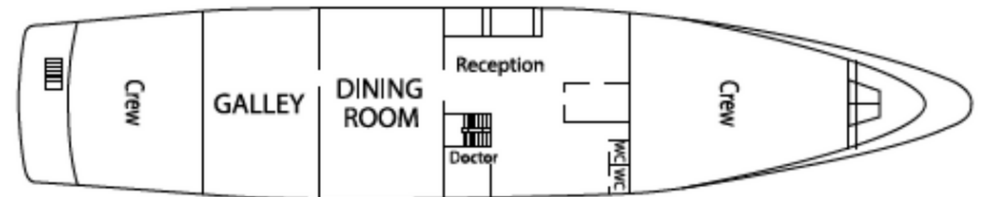

# The Fine Print

Please read carefully before booking.

## Payments: Individual Booking

Deposits due within three business days of booking. Reservations are not confirmed until a deposit is received. Deposit is refundable up to 72 hours after payment is received. Premium payment for our Travel Protection Plan is optional. For more information, visit the travel protection page under the Booking tab on our main website. Final payment is due 90 days prior to departure from your home city or in full when reservations are confirmed if less than 90 days prior. If final payment is not received in time, your space may be released; rebooking will then be subject to final availability. Payments may be made by check, credit card, wire transfer, or money order.

## Deposit Required

\$500 per person  
\$2,000 per person (Galápagos cruises)

## Private Charters

Deposit equal to one-third of the total charter cost is due within seven business days of the reservation. At 270 days (9 months) before departure, a second payment equal to one-third of the total charter cost is due. Final charter payment is due 120 days (4 months) prior to departure.

## Cancellation Policy

Guests who cancel for any reason are subject to the following cancellation fees.

90+ days prior to departure - 100% of deposit payment is non-refundable but transferrable. Funds can be transferred to a Future Travel Certificate. Future Travel Certificates can be applied toward the price of a new reservation traveling before the end of the following calendar year. Future Travel Certificates have no cash value and cannot be used for deposit payments. A new deposit will need to be placed, based on current terms, to confirm travel. Future Travel Certificates are transferable to a new passenger, on a separate voyage, the same terms apply.

**A reservation or future travel credit re-accommodated to a new sailing date is a one-time only move and remains non-refundable. Cancellation of your re-booked cruise will result in the loss of any reservation payments on file at time of re-accommodation. Please note if guest has opted to participate in a special promotion, additional terms may be in place for that promotion that guest has agreed to.**

61-90 days prior to departure - forfeit of 66.67% of full gross cruise fare. Portion returned to guest will be done so in the form of a refund.

0-60 days prior to departure - forfeit of 100% of full gross cruise fare.

## Pre-/Post-Cruise Land Packages

Deposits are non-refundable. Payment and cancellation terms differ for optional hotel and land packages.

## Travel Protection

To help protect you and your trip investment against the unexpected, we recommend purchasing a travel protection plan that provides coverage for Trip Cancellation, Trip Interruption, Trip Delay, Baggage Loss or Delay, Emergency Medical Expense and more. ## Gratuities

Gratuities are shared among crew members and are not included in your fare. Recommended amount is typically \$25-35 per day per person.

## Final Travel Details

All travel information is sent via email. If your reservation is paid in full and we have received your required online Guest Forms, Final Travel Details will be issued approximately 45 days prior to your departure. Submit all required Guest Forms online no later than 60 days prior to your departure. **Late receipt of online Guest Forms and/or Final Payment will delay your Final Travel Details.**

## Family Discoveries Savings

Children ages 8-17 years (at time of travel) save \$500 per child. Age guidelines are waived on all private charters. It is the responsibility of parents or guardians to supervise their children at all times.

## Smoking

Smoking is allowed only in designated areas on outside aft decks. Smoking is not allowed inside the vessels at any time.

## Health and Disability Requirements

Guests must notify us in writing at the time of booking of any physical or mental illness,

disability or other conditions for which special accommodations or the use of a wheelchair is necessary or contemplated. We must also be notified of any medical treatment that may render the guest unfit for travel or constitute a risk or danger to the guest or anyone else on board. Guests needing any form of assistance and those who are physically disabled must be accompanied by someone who takes full responsibility for any needed assistance during the cruise and in the event of an emergency. We reserve the right to refuse passage to anyone who, in our sole opinion, may affect the health, safety, or enjoyment of other guests.

Guests requiring a wheelchair must provide their own collapsible wheelchair. Some ports of call, shore excursions, docks, gangways, and other ship requirements may preclude a wheelchair guest from leaving the vessel; this decision will be made by the captain and is binding. Additionally, there may be certain physical conditions, including raised doorway thresholds from 2 to 16 inches, stairways, and narrow passageways within the vessel that may limit or preclude the accessibility of wheelchair guests to some areas.

Due to the limitations of vessel facilities, bookings cannot be accepted for women who will be 30 or more weeks pregnant at the conclusion of travel. Women in their third trimester (greater than 24 weeks, but less than 30 weeks) must submit a letter from their physician granting permission to travel by boat (and for air travel, if applicable).
